

# MIAMI - EAT

NAME	HOOD	DEETS
KYU	<i>Wynwood</i>	This is a Miami staple and consistently one of the best Asian fusion restaurants here – ambiance + food never disappoint.
PALMAR	<i>Wynwood</i>	Probably one of the best Chinese food spots in Miami, the menu offers an array of dim sum style plates and a great natural wine and sake list worth testing out. Come hungry
OMAKAI	<i>Wynwood</i>	The Sugarfish of Miami (but in our opinion, better)
DOMA	<i>Wynwood</i>	A great outdoor terrace – the menu is a mix of healthy vegetable forward appetizers, topped off with stellar pasta choices. The Hamachi Carpaccio Risotto is our personal favorite.
MANDOLIN	<i>Design District</i>	Walking into Mandolin, you instantly feel transported to Greece. We suggest coming with a group of friends, ordering the entire menu and spending hours sipping on their famous white Sangria pitchers.
TIGRE	<i>Little River</i>	A new vision on Argentinian cuisine with a great cocktail program and detail in design. It's nice to come here for sunset and stay for dinner and drinks.
LA NATURAL	<i>Little River</i>	Veggie forward plates and wood grilled pizza with the absolute fluffiest / best dough ever, this place boasts chill, low-key vibes and a focus on natural wines.
JAGUAR SUN	<i>Little River</i>	Hands down our favorite spot, such a great ambiance & vibe. Outdoor area with open fire grill, picnic tables and a killer DJ playing disco jams. The menu is that of a steak house, but more casual. This is a MUST.
PHUC YEA	<i>MiMo</i>	What do you get when you mix Cajun with Latin/Asian Influence? Bursting-with-flavor deliciousness. Make sure to bring backup. You are going to want to try lots of things on the menu.
BOIA DE	<i>Little Haiti</i>	This place is literally in a strip mall, but - the Italian food is incredible. Innovative, interesting, and just mind-blowingly good. Highly recommended – and totally worth eating outside in a parking lot.
CAFÉ LA TROVA	<i>Little Havana</i>	If you want to get real Miami, go to Café La Trova. It's a Cuban fusion spot by well known chef Michelle Bernstein and bartender Julio Cabrera that has an incredible live Cuban band. Come here for a night of dinner + dancing.
LUNG YAI TAPAS	<i>Little Havana</i>	A hole in the wall Thai spot ( the best kind, right?) – there's always a line but well worth it. Plus, you can drink sake and beer while you wait on the sidewalk.
MATSURI	<i>Coral Way</i>	A local's sushi spot, you definitely get the best bang for your buck here with their extensive sushi list.



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<b>BOMBAY DARBAR</b>	<i>Coconut Grove</i>	Best spot for Indian food in Miami – it's a very casual spot but WOW, THE FOOD!
<b>MISTER 01</b>	<i>Coconut Grove</i>	Go, and order their Star Luca pizza. The ricotta stuffed crust melts in your mouth.
<b>PLANTA QUEEN</b>	<i>Coconut Grove</i>	Different from the OG spot on the beach, this menu is Asian focused and features vegan versions of the classics such as egg rolls, fried rice and buns.
<b>KRUS</b>	<i>Coconut Grove</i>	A veg forward seasonal menu curated by world renowned chef Sebastian Vargas using the freshest local ingredients. They also have an amazing selection of natural wine and now offer tastings.
<b>OSAKA</b>	<i>Brickell</i>	This Nikkei restaurant from Peru is top, top, top - the food, service, presentation all on point.
<b>LA MAR</b>	<i>Brickell</i>	Chic waterfront spot with great Peruvian fusion offerings by chef Gaston Acurio. Food is delish but the view's even better.
<b>MILA</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	The new see and be seen spot with a cool minimalistic rooftop design. The food isn't exactly the star of the show, but it's perfect to take that friend that's in town and looking for a vibey spot.
<b>SUSHI GARAGE</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	Cool spot set in a former auto body shop serving Japanese classics, inventive nigiri & cocktails.
<b>27</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	Casual, cozy and laid back. The menu fuses Korean with Latin American and Mediterranean – a random mix but a great combo, it turns out. Another top spot we always recommend.
<b>MACCHIALINA</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	Rustic Italian restaurant with a large outdoor patio space with some of the best pasta in Miami. You MUST order the Pomodoro, it's the best thing on the menu.
<b>WAYKU</b>	<i>Wynwood</i>	Experimental culinary and mixology experience with traditional Andean elements with a fun vibe.
<b>WATR @ 1 HOTEL</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	Peruvian – Japanese inspired cuisine set on a pretty impressive rooftop with a great vibe. We recommend this spot for lunch or sunset drinks, especially for your friends visiting town.
<b>LUCALI</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	One of the best pizza spots in Miami, but don't forget to order the kale salad. Seriously, don't.
<b>CEVICHE 105</b>	<i>Miami Beach</i>	A hole in the wall Peruvian spot with the best flavor at a reasonable price. You must have their pisco & ceviche sampler.

MELINDA'S	<i>Downtown</i>	The people of ATV records opened an outdoor tropical oasis with a great cocktail menu and tunes ranging from live Bossa Nova to disco DJs.
BOHO	<i>Wynwood</i>	A lively Bohemian outdoor bar with a great lineup of DJs every weekend.
BROKEN SHAKER	<i>South Beach</i>	A chill backyard oasis offering an eclectic menu of handcrafted cocktails
OVER UNDER	<i>Downtown</i>	This place meshes a cocktail bar and dive bar in one. It's casual and cool - you almost feel like you have been transported to a bar in NYC. The music is great and bartenders are really friendly.
GITANO	<i>Miami Beach</i>	A cool rooftop for good cocktails & ambiance inside Casa Faena.
LAGNIAPPE	<i>Wynwood</i>	This place feels very much like having wine and cheese in your friend's backyard, if your friend's backyard had live music and cool thrifted furniture to sit on.
1 HOTEL BEACH	<i>Miami Beach</i>	This beach club is a great spot to come Saturdays or Sundays with friends to have lunch and stay for drinks.
JOIA BEACH CLUB	<i>South Beach</i>	A hip & beautiful European inspired beach club boasting Miami's epic skyline and waterfront views. Great spot for lunch or dinner. On the weekends, stay for sunset drinks and enjoy the live music.
CLEAT	<i>Key Biscayne</i>	Casual, low- key spot located in a marina in Key Biscayne next to Boater's Grille
HEARTLAND	<i>Little Haiti</i>	Outdoors, live music, string lights, wines, you get the gist. Oh, and wood burning food, guacho style. Great for groups.
FREEHOLD	<i>Wynwood</i>	OG from Brooklyn - a workspace, bar and pizzeria all rolled into one. They have great programming Monday - Sunday, but it's great spot to listen to well-known local DJs on the weekend.
THE NEW YORKER	<i>MiMo</i>	A very casual spot, with rotating DJ's spinning cool classics on Friday's. It's an easy place to tell a big group and you don't have to worry about reservations.
THE ANDERSON	<i>MiMO</i>	The outdoors is relaxed - set up like an urban beach with picnic tables and a brightly colored tiki-shack. Indoors, you will find a full party going on with DJ sets – pick your poison.
SWEET LIBERTY	<i>Miami Beach</i>	This spot is known for their cocktails and great music – come for happy hour or after dinner dancing.
